

C.T.A (W.A) Wildflowers and Wineries Pannier Cycle Tour

date: October 5 - 13 1991

This is a self supporting camping tour that takes in many of W.A's south west scenic spots including, vineyards, orchards, caves, wildflowers, tall timbered forests, rivers, rugged coastline, tranquil beaches, native wildlife and historic buildings. There will be an accomodation charge of \$75 for the tour, which covers YHA and camping fees. Transport, food, and all other incidental costs will need to be met by the individual.

The CTA cycle trailer will be available for carrying up to 16 bikes. Car pooling will be encouraged as a limited number of secured parking bays is available in Busselton.

There will be a pre tour meeting for participants on Friday September 27 at Murdoch Uni at 7pm.

The tour starts from Busselton on Saturday October 5, the riders will meet at the old Jetty at 11.00 am. The first day's ride will take us westwards along Geographe Bay to Dunsborough, where we intend to stay at the local YHA A YHA sleeping sheet is necessary.

The second day sees us ride out to exposed Cape Naturaliste taking in deep breaths of what must be the purest air in Australia. Then we retrace our steps and follow the rugged coastline towards Margaret River, passing some of the well renowned local vineyards. We intend to stay the second night at Margaret River campground.

The third day sees us cruise through limestone cave country towards tranquil Hamelin Bay, where we will camp for the night.

The fourth day sees us head inland to the timber town of Nannup, this day is quite long and there is no shops or settlements for most of this route.

On day five we ride through Karri forested countryside to the Pemberton YHA.

Day six is a designated rest day for the riders, however there are many scenic delights to be had in the district, if you feel inclined to do some exploring! Pemberton will be our basecamp for nights five and six. On day seven we take the quiet back roads passing by Donnelly Mill to Bridgetown.

Day eight sees us ride through Balingup and along beautiful Blackwood River road to Nannup, claimed by many to be the prettiest road in W.A. The Nannup campground will be our final night on the tour.

Day nine sees us ride to Busselton and finish a wonderful cycling holiday.
