With the start of the New Year we look forward to an exciting and enjoyable cycling programme. The new committee will be continuing the good work of past years and aiming to provide even greater variety and scope for the cycle tourist in 1983.

The culmination of 1982 was an extremely well attended Annual General Meeting. To recap the highlights of the past year the following are extracts from the President's Report.

1982 PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I have much pleasure in presenting the Annual Report for our association for 1982.

Come rain, hail or shine, our programme of rides and tours continued throughout 1982 and the C.T.A. has now conducted more than 400 rides since its inception. Each year's programme is better balanced than the previous one and 1982 was no exception. Although our overall membership has levelled out at about 180, our average ride attendances of 22 is slightly up on 1981. Cycling with the C.T.A. continues to be the safest way to ride, despite two accidents on official C.T.A. rides that required medical treatment. In those 400 odd rides the C.T.A. has only once been without an officail ride leader and I believe that record speaks volumes for the dependability of the leaders and the reputation of the C.T.A.

Despite our low political profile C.T.A.'s standing within the community as a responsible, well-organised, recreational body continued to be reinforced during the year. In the past twelve months the C.T.A.'s opinion has been sought by the State Government Bicycle Committee, the National Safety Council, the Main Roads Department and the Department for Youth, Sport and Recreation.

THE RIDES PROGRAMME

The programme for the past year was a balance between old favourites and new ideas. Of the new rides that were tried and were successful, the Mundaring Weir Weekend, the 40 Km time trial and the Yunderup weekend were clear winners. The concept of multiple starts for rides was tried and has won favour with all riders.

In the 1981 report I indicated that the C.T.A. had two major goals in 1982. The first of those goals was the running of an overseas or interstate tour. I am pleased to report to you that C.T.A. Tour No. 12 will leave Perth in approximately 5 weeks for a 23 day tour around Tasmania. Tour No. 13 to Bali, Indonesia, Malaysia could occur in late '83 or '84.

The second goal was that of investigating the possibility of establishing regional branches of the C.T.A. The committee discussed this complex issue at length and resolved that although the proposal had merit and would inevitably occur, at present we had neither the administrative manpower, nor the members to enter this new phase of development.

FUNDING

The committee is concerned that the publication of the newsletter has become a major drain on the C.T.A.'s resources. I believe a major challenge of the new committee will be to trim production costs by streamlining the newsletter format while at the same time promoting the sale of increased advertising space.

ACCIDENTS

During 1982 there were two accidents that required medical attention. Barry Penton required stitches after gashing his hand on

a chainwheel (the bike was stationary) and Dennis Braddon landed heavily in the gravel after touching a back wheel on a downhill

It is interesting to note that there were no accidents on C.T.A. rides involving motor vehicles. In fact there never has been.

LEGAL

At present there are two cases being handled by the C.T.A.'s Cyclist Defence Fund, one a carry-over from 1981 plus one new case from 1982.

THANKS

The C.T.A. committee has continued to operate quietly and efficiently throughout 1982. I would like to congratulate and thank the committee for the many hours they have contributed.

As most of you are aware I will be stepping down from the Presidency and the committee this year. It is re-assuring to know that there are a number of keen and capable people willing to fill the spaces on the committee. After 8 years the C.T.A. has a solid foundation on which to grow, it is financially sound, and most important of all, it has a core of cycle enthusiasts who love life and share in a spirit of comradeship that will ensure its continued growth and success.






