For those who work in Perth City or in Fremantle, the "carrot" will be a free breakfast and the opportunity to see how easy it really is to commute on a bike.

The main aim of Bikeweek is to raise the profile of cycling in Perth, to make people aware that the bicycle is a transportation vehicle and not a toy. We may not have such an impressive-looking programme as some of the eastern states' equivalents (this year - you wait for next year!), but we can make a lot of noise and get a lot of publicity. The greater the number of cyclists who attend, the greater the effect, so make sure you come along, especially to the Rally (Sunday 24 March) or the Commuter Day (Wednesday 27 March).

Albany Long Weekend Tour, 26-28 January, 1985

On the way we detoured in order to visit the famed Natural Bridge and the awe-inspiring Gap. Lunch was enjoyed in a shady little park commanding a glorious view of Frenchmans Bay, with the low outline of the Porongorups in the distant background. Bob and Ben Stockman headed back early, realizing, no doubt, that their cruising speed would be hampered somewhat by their obvious overindulgence in homemade bread puddings. The return trip to Albany town was interrupted by a nasty blowout (no, not Ben and Bob!) which wrecked Susan Campbell's new tyre and tube. The crack CTA pursuit team quickly fetched a replacement tyre. By the way, have you all noticed how there is never any shortage of helpers when a lady member is in distress

The evening guided bus tour to Mt Clarence and Mt Melville was literally a highlight of the beautiful clear night. The fine, sunny conditions remained with us all day and showed no sign of changing. The steady brisk pace maintained on the return trip did not deter 11 year old Ben Stockman, who was experiencing his first real weekend tour with the club under the proud but watchful eye of father, Bob.

At 8.20 am on Monday, we bad farewell to new-found friends at the hostel. The cyclists headed off to the pre-arranged rendezvous in the Porongorups. Five of us including bus-driver Geoff Creighton, keen to go bush-walking, travelled in the bus and had completed a climb to Castle Rock by the time the cyclists arrived.

As we headed back to Perth, the mood in the bus was rather subdued; we were no doubt sorry that the delightful and spledidly-organized tour was rapidly drawing to a close.


